# MINUTES OF THE 122<sup>nd</sup> MEETING OF THE CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE & DAVIDSON COUNTY

The 122<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on October 5, 2023 at 9:00 a.m. in the Administrative Conference Room of the Administrative Offices at the Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

Chair Norah Buikstra opened the meeting for business at 9:03 a.m. and stated that a guorum was present.

**ACTION:** Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

Chair Norah Buikstra read the Mission Statement of Music City Center (Attachment #1) and there was discussion.

There were no members of the public present or anyone who wished to speak during the public comment period.

**ACTION:** Vonda McDaniel made a motion to approve the 121<sup>st</sup> Meeting Minutes of September 7, 2023. The motion was seconded by Alfred Degrafinreid II and approved unanimously by the Authority.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is Thursday, November 2, 2023, at 9:00 am. Charles Starks and Board Attorney Charles Robert Bone discussed draft documents which included public comment guidelines, request forms, and meeting agendas (Attachments #1 and #2) related to public comment periods, which are now required for all future CCA public meetings, including committee meetings, under the updated Tennessee Open Meetings Law, and there was discussion.

Board Attorney Charles Robert Bone noted the language can be amended in the future as the Board deems necessary.

**ACTION:** Robert Davidson made a motion approving the Public Comment Period Guidelines. The motion was seconded by Seema Prasad and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Charles Starks provided an Operations update, and there was discussion.

Charles Starks provided an update on the monthly STR, LLC Hotel Statistics. Starks referred the board to their packets for additional monthly statistics including tax collections (Attachment #1), and there was discussion.

With no additional business, the Authority unanimously moved to adjourn at 9:35 a.m.

## **Convention Center Authority Public Comment Period**

The meetings of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville & Davidson County ("Authority") are open to members of the public and the Authority will reserve time for public comment pursuant to Tenn. Code § 8-44-112.

Minutes are a summary of the Authority's discussions and actions; therefore, public comments and written materials submitted by the public may not be reflected in the minutes.

## **Public Comment Guidelines**

Advance notice is required to make public comments. Requests must be made in writing no later than three (3) calendar days or 72 hours prior to the meeting. Request forms are available on the Music City Center website at <a href="https://www.nashvillemcc.com/about/convention-center-authority">https://www.nashvillemcc.com/about/convention-center-authority</a>. Completed requests should be emailed to <a href="https://ccapubliccommentperiod@nashvillemcc.com">ccapubliccommentperiod@nashvillemcc.com</a>.

Comments are limited to six (6) speakers per meeting and up to three (3) minutes for each individual speaker. Warnings will be given before the end of the three-minute time limit, and speakers will be stopped at three minutes. At the discretion of the Chair, the Chair may permit up to three (3) speakers, in addition to the allotted six, that are neutral (speaking neither for or against the agenda item that they are speaking on) for up to three (3) minutes each.

Speakers will be chosen in the order in which requests are received and based on the position of each indivdual speaker to allow equal representation of supportive and opposing viewpoints. To avoid repetitiveness, groups are encouraged to select a spokesperson to speak on their behalf. Speakers will be notified via email prior to the meeting whether they have been selected to speak at the meeting.

Comments must be germane to an item listed on the meeting agenda on the date in which the speaker appears. Those who make comments on topics other than the selected topic may be asked to stop speaking.

Authority members will not respond to questions or engage in discussion with speakers. The public comment periods are opportunities for Authority members appointed by state and local leadership to hear from community members and stakeholders.

Speakers should at all times maintain proper decorum and shall make comments in a civil manner. Personal attacks will not be tolerated. No person will be allowed to make obscene, derogatory, or slanderous remarks.



## Public Comment Request Form

The Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville & Davidson County provides a public comment period at the beginning of each scheduled meeting. The guidelines for the public comment period permit no more than six (6) individuals to address the board at any single meeting, and each speaker will be limited to three (3) minutes to present to the board.

Requests to speak during the public comment period must be submitted in writing at least three days prior to the meeting. Requests should be emailed to <u>ccapubliccommentperiod@nashvillemcc.com</u>. Speakers will be notified via email whether they have been selected to speak at the meeting.
